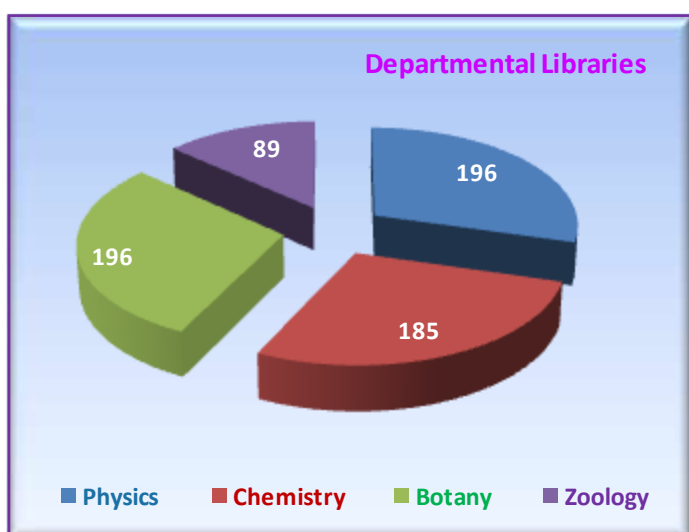
LIBRARY

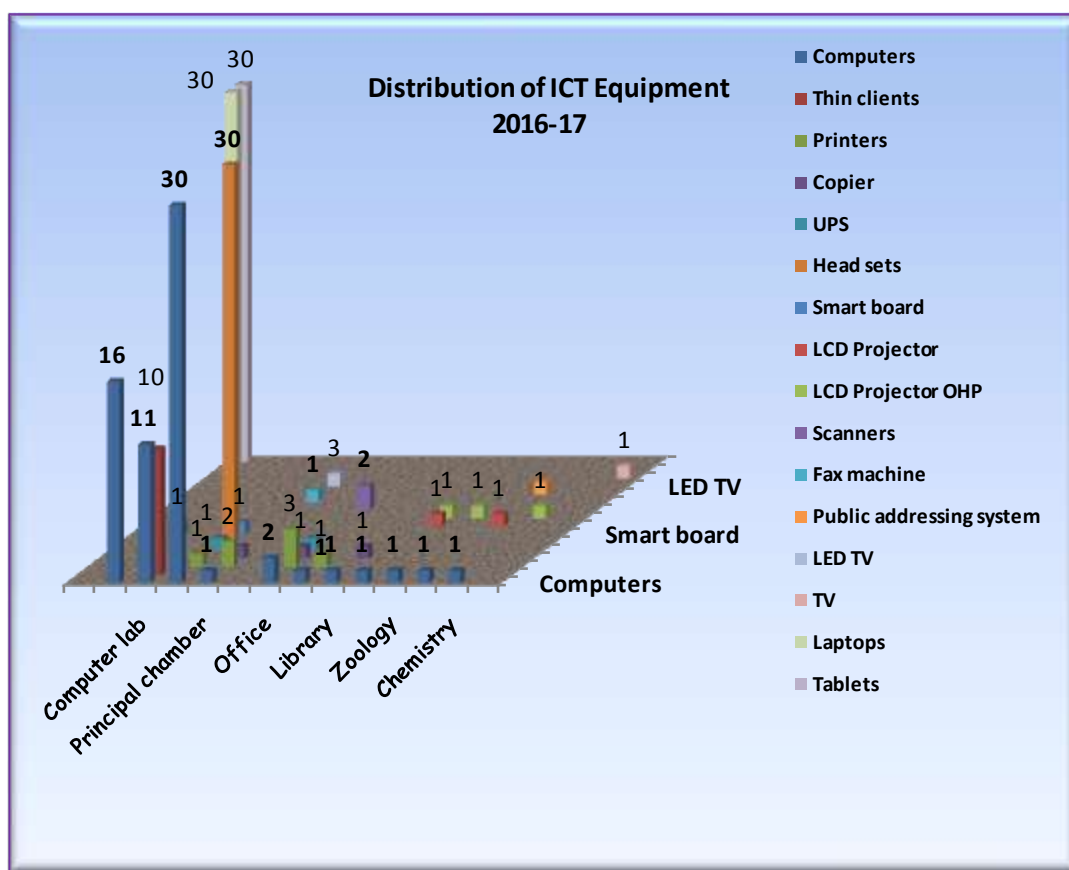

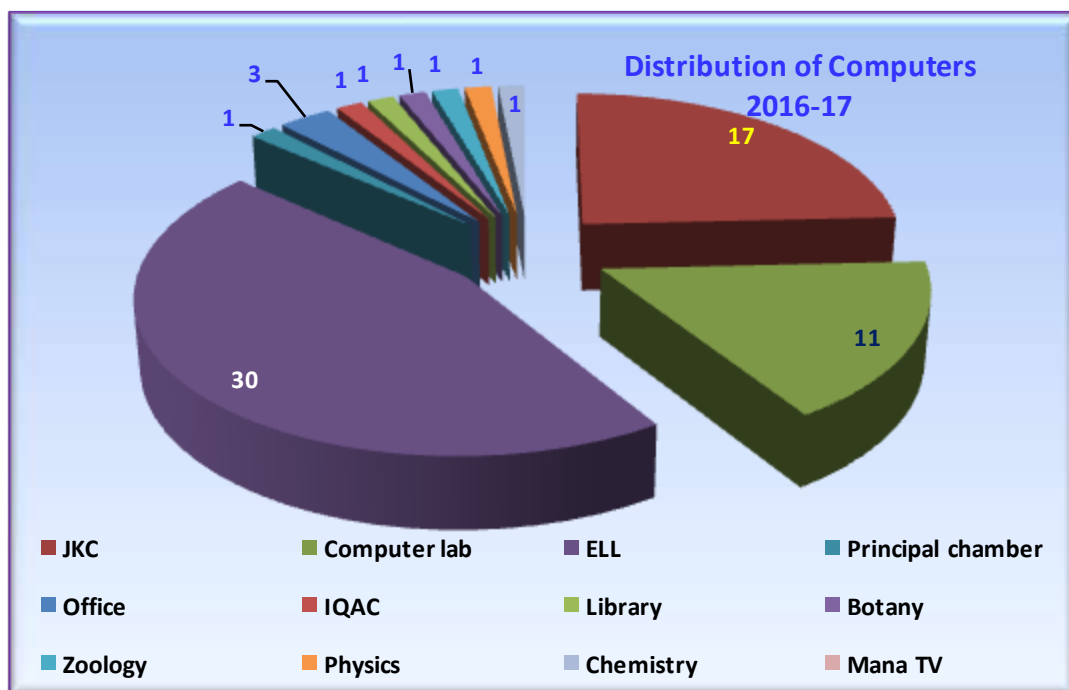
ICT Equipment

Distribution of ICT Equipment: 2016-17

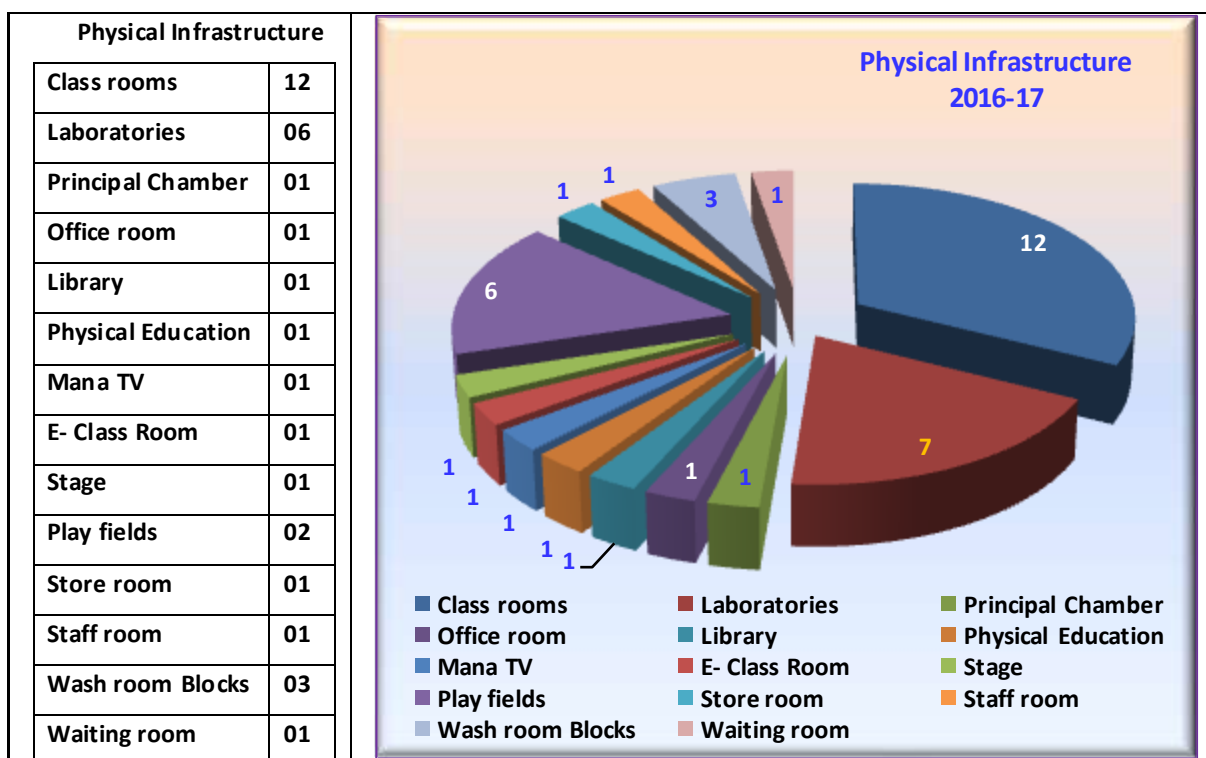


Lab wise and Department wise Distribution of Computers
